

## Student Internet Quotas

In order to encourage responsible usage of the Internet, a system of reducing individual Internet downloads for students has now been put in place within the College.

Each term students are allocated a number of megabytes that they can download, this is called their Internet Download Quota. At the start of term 3 in 2008, this quota has been set to the value of 2000 megabytes.


This quota can only be exceeded by those downloading very large files or viewing and listening to excessive music and video. Normal activity such as web browsing and checking emails will safely keep students under their quota.

If this quota is exceeded then the speed of all downloads for that student will be reduced to 64kbs (from broadband speed to the speed of a modem).

If your quota has been exceeded and you wish to avoid any speed restrictions you will need to contact Student Services to arrange an appointment with the Deputy Principal of Administration.

### Viewing Your Quota Usage

In the lower-right taskbar of your Windows® computer

you will see this icon . If you Left-Click on this icon, a window will open as shown to the right. This shows how many megabytes you have left. In this example, the user has 1,423 megabytes left until their download speed will be reduced.
